Identification tips:

Leaves: Opposite; smooth edges; 3 to 5 veins that tend to follow leaf edges toward tip

Fruit: White berry on reddish stem

Twig: Light brown with brownish pith

About this shrub:



- Fruit eaten by ring-necked pheasant, ruffed grouse, and sharptail grouse
- Grows well in poor soil conditions
- Grows 8 feet tall; 5 feet wide
- Hardiness zone 3
